PEPPARKAKOR COOKIES



½ tbsp ground cinnamon ½ tsp of ground cardamom

½ tsp bicarbonate of soda

1/2 tsp ground cloves

50ml water

225g plain flour

INGREDIENTS

- 75g butter125g soft light-brown sugar
- 25g golden syrup
- 25g golde
- 10g treacle
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tbsp ground ginger
- 1. Mix the butter, sugar, syrup, and treacle in a saucepan. Heat gently until the butter melts, stirring continuously.
- 2. Add the spices and mix thoroughly. Add the bicarbonate of soda, water and flour, and stir thoroughly until it is completely mixed in.
- Empty the mixture into a bowl. When cool, cover with cling film and then leave the dough to rest in the fridge (ideally overnight).
- Preheat the oven to 200°C. Knead the dough and then roll it out thinly on a lightly floured surface. Cut it into shapes using a biscuit cutter.
- 5. Transfer to a greased baking tray and bake for 5–8 minutes until golden brown. Keep an eye on them as they burn very easily, but they should be crisp.
- 6. Leave to cool on the baking sheets as they break easily when hot.
- 7. When cooled, decorate with icing and enjoy!
- **PIPPI LONGSTOCKING**

In 2020, Pippi Longstocking turns 75! Or, to be completely accurate, the first book about Pippi turns 75-Pippi herself will always be the free-spirited nine-year-old we know so well. The first Pippi Longstocking story was published in the autumn of 1945. From a world devastated by war, Astrid Lindgren wrote about a completely new type of girl character. A strong, kind, curious, anti-authoritarian, and playful girl who makes extraordinary things happen. With her mismatched stockings, carrot-coloured hair and freckly face, not to mention super-human strength and resilience, Pippi Longstocking has become a cultural icon.

ABOUT THE BOOK

Pippi Longstocking is a fiery heroine. She lives in her house–Villa Villekulla– with only her monkey and horse for company because her father was a sea captain who's been missing, and her mother died when she was young. When Tommy and Annika, who live next door, meet Pippi, they love her at once. The three become great friends and have adventures. In fact adventure and sometimes trouble seem to follow Pippi.

There are some really funny parts to the story that will have kids laughing along. There are also some touching and thought-provoking parts that are worth talking about. Pippi is a little girl, living alone. And despite her animal friends that live with her and Tommy and Annika next door, she has to fend for herself and misses her parents. You might ask students if they think it is entirely realistic that a young person like Pippi is living by herself without any adult supervision. Why or why not?

HASS CONNECTIONS

 Pippi Longstocking is set in Sweden.
 Encourage students to find out more about Sweden and its culture. They could label it on a map and share Swedish fun facts they have uncovered.

LANGUAGE ARTS CONNECTIONS

- In chapter two, Pippi is a thing-finder. Ask students what they would like to find if they went on a thing-finding expedition? Using the directions from the book, take students on a Thing Finding expedition. Have the students each present what they found and how they can use their things.
- Pippi is a very interesting character. Have students draw a character map describing her and giving examples from the book.
- Pippi is very different from other children, and it's obvious when she's around Tommy and Annika. Use a Venn diagram to contrast Pippi and Annika.
- Although each chapter in Pippi Longstocking is a separate adventure, the book also has definite rising action, a climax, and falling action. Identify these together as a class.
- Pippi has a very unusual house. Using the description of Villa Villekulla from the book, students could draw what they think Pippi's house looked like.
- The protagonist in most novels features the main character or 'good guy'. The protagonist of *Pippi Longstocking* is, of

course, Pippi, a feisty young girl who experiences many exciting adventures as the story unfolds. Ask students to think back on some of their favourite characters from past novels they have read or movies they've seen. Ask them what they think makes for an especially interesting protagonist?

 Challenge students to come up with a way to teach Pippi her alphabet that would be easier for her to understand than the flashcards that were tried by her teacher.

HANDS-ON ACTIVITIES

- Have students create a work of art that displays each part of Pippi's enormously long name.
- A storyboard is a series of pictures that tell about an important event in a story. A storyboard can tell the story of only one scene – or the entire novel. Ask students to create a storyboard for all or part of this book
- In chapter two, Pippi makes pepparkakor cookies. These thin ginger-spiced biscuits are traditional in Sweden particularly at Christmas time. Make some as a class using the recipe above (makes around 75 pepparkakor).

P.E CONNECTIONS

- Pippi is extremely strong. Hold a strength contest in whatever form you desire, eg arm wrestling.
- Play a massive game of tag with the class and have students later write about why this was so appealing for Pippi.







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ABOUT THE BOOK

Bungawitta has struggled through drought for a long time. Once a busy place, it has shrunk over the years as families and businesses moved away. There are only twelve stubborn locals left, and they are running out of water and money. How can they save their town before time runs out?

WRITING STYLE

Bungawitta is written in a light, funny, positive style and the characters often use old-fashioned Australian colloquialisms. The style highlights the quirky characters, and makes their harsh predicament easier to digest. The themes of Bungawitta include drought, problems facing Australian country towns, the city/country divide, problem-solving, the power of teamwork, cooperation, community, friendship and individual talent.

BEFORE READING

Depending on your region, students may already be familiar with water restrictions, or with drought and floods. Before reading *Bungawitta*, students could discuss as a class their existing knowledge of weather conditions or drought/flooding events in different parts of Australia.

AFTER READING

- Draw a map/plan of Bungawitta, showing all the main places mentioned in the story.
- Make posters to advertise the Bungawitta festival, using paint and/ or collage.
- Imagine you are living through a severe drought. Write a poem about how it feels and what it is like. Or perhaps write about what it is like when the rain finally comes. What if you were Glory-Alice, who is seeing rain for the first time? Use your senses to make the poem feel real. What do you see, hear, smell etc?
- Ben Wise says 'We've been dealing with a big, bad, spiteful old Dry' (p106), as if the drought is a person, or a monster, with its own will. Use this technique—personification-to write a short version of *Bungawitta* from the drought's point of view. Imagine that you are the 'bad old Dry'. What would a drought look like, if it were a person? What would it say?
- Write a press release for the Bungawitta Festival, like Lola Riley did. It is a one-page written report about your event, sent to TV stations, radio stations and newspapers. It should have an attention-getting headline and the report that follows should make the festival sound as exciting as possible, and mention the main attractions, and when and where it takes place. It should have contact phone numbers at the bottom, in case the journalists want more information.

- A few of the citizens of Bungawitta use old Australian slang, eg Aunty Flo says'my bung knee gave me curry' (page 6), and Cookie says 'stone the crows' (p24). Do you know any other old Australian slang words and phrases? Ask family and friends to help you and together compile a class list of phrases.
- Write a theme song for the Bungawitta Festival. The song would be like an ad for the Festival. Make up your own tune, or use the tune to a song you already know and just change the words.
- As a class, brainstorm and discuss the advantages and disadvantages of city life versus country life.
- The people of Bungawitta decided to try to attract tourists by having a festival with a sculpture theme. In groups, or as a class, think of an idea for a theme festival your school or class could have on a small budget, taking your local area and talents into account. Think of a slogan for your festival and make posters to advertise it. What sort of food would you sell? What other things would you sell? Where would you put the tables? Draw a map of the festival site. Would you have music?
- The people of Bungawitta had six weeks to organise their festival. Using the information given in the story to help you, write a list of all the things they had to do in this time. Then, arrange the list in order-starting with what should be done first (eg ordering the portable toilets to make sure they



are booked) and what should be done at the last minute (eg filling the eskies with ice, putting out the food for sale on tables).

- At 10:30am on Festival Day, Lola says they 'break even', and that anything else is 'profit'. What does this mean? The people of Bungawitta make a profit on the festival, by earning more from ticket sales and food sales than they spent on organising the festival. Imagine you are running a cake stall at a market or festival, and work out the following:
 - > The ingredients for the cakes cost you \$50. Plastic wrap, paper plates and cardboard for signs cost you \$10. You hire a table for \$20. What are your initial total costs? Answer: \$80
 - You make ten cakes. Each cake is cut into eight slices. How many slices do you have? What price per slice will allow you to break even, if you sell all the cake? Answers: 80, \$13
 - > What would happen if you raised the price of your cake? If your cake was \$2 per slice, how much profit would you make, if you sold all the cake? Answers: \$160 sales minus \$80 initial costs = \$80 profit
 - > To make a bigger profit, you could of course raise the price of your cake. Or, you could reduce your initial costs. How might you do that? A: Borrow a table instead of hiring one, use recycled cardboard for signs instead of buying it new, make a simpler cake without any fancy expensive ingredients, ask for ingredients to be donated.
